Addressing the 36 Guiding Principles



Background

The Municipality of South Bruce entered the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) site selection process in 2012, alongside 21 other Canadian communities. At the time, South Bruce Council opted to learn more and consider the long-term community opportunities and impacts of hosting the Project that would store Canada's used nuclear fuel in a deep geologic repository.

In October 2020, South Bruce Council endorsed <u>36 Guiding</u> <u>Principles</u> (the Principles) to help the Municipality evaluate and fully understand the potential effects of hosting the NWMO Project in South Bruce.

The Principles, were based on expectations, aspirations, key concerns, and questions about the Project expressed by community members at a series of workshops in the winter of 2019-2020. The results were summarized in a **Project Visioning report**. Letters to council, delegations and other community input received since 2012 also informed the development of the Principles.

These Principles became the foundation of South Bruce's continued, intensive review of the Project, guiding what studies were needed to understand potential impact, as well as guiding community assessment and municipal discussion with the NWMO.

The Principles are organized into themes: Safety and the Environment (Principles 1-7), People, Community and Culture (Principles 8-19), Economics and Finance (Principles 20-23), Capacity Building (Principles 24-27), Services and Infrastructure (Principles 28-33), Governance and Engagement (Principles 34-35) and Regional Benefits (Principle 36).

Addressing the Principles

Some Guiding Principles relate to the site selection process while others are relevant to subsequent phases of the Project, if South Bruce is willing and selected to host the DGR. There are Principles that can be addressed through a straightforward commitment or have already been fulfilled. Some will require more information to fully address after a site is selected. Processes, such as federal Impact Assessment and licencing, will inform how some site-specific Principles are addressed.

The Principles are being considered and addressed through a variety of means, including:

- Socio-economic and Environmental Studies with independent Peer Reviews to better understand potential effects of the Project, how to mitigate risks and maximize opportunities
- The 2022 Memorandum of Understanding between the Municipality and the NWMO, which set the foundation for negotiations based on the Guiding Principles
- The 2024 Hosting Agreement which lays out commitments for different site selection scenarios
- Federal/Provincial Legislation and Processes including Impact Assessment
- South Bruce Council Motions and Bylaws
- Existing Multi-Year Funding Agreement between the NWMO and the Municipality of South Bruce

Safety and the Environment

Principles 1-7 focus on safety and the environment. While study work has informed these Principles, they will be addressed more fully through a federal Impact Assessment and/or the CNSC licensing processes that would follow site selection.

People, Community and Culture

Principles 8 and 9 speak to community support for the Project. Willingness to be a host community will be measured (Principle 9) by a community-driven process. The NWMO will respect the results of this process, which includes a referendum (Principle 8).

Principles 10–19 address local social and economic impacts, including protecting businesses and property values, and promoting tourism and agriculture. These are addressed through NWMO programs, policy, and funding commitments described in the Hosting Agreement. As well, a community-benefits payment to South Bruce will support these goals.

South Bruce has made commitments to Indigenous Reconciliation per Principle 17. South Bruce acknowledges First Nations stewardship of the land, is educating staff on reconciliation and continuing its dialogue with Indigenous communities.

Economics and Finance

Principles 20 to 23 speak to opportunities for local business, local employment, and training. As part of the Hosting Agreement, the NWMO commits to supporting local suppliers and businesses.

Table 1 follows on the next page. It provides a high-level picture of each Principle and the many sources that address it.

Table 2 includes a more detailed list of each study, section of the MOU or Hosting Agreement or other sources as they pertain to the Principles. It is found in the <u>Appendix</u>.

Capacity Building

Participating in the site selection process requires hiring outside expertise and added capacity – beyond what municipal taxpayers could support. This work is important for the Municipality to understand the potential effects of the project locally.

Principles 24 to 27 speak to how the NWMO will compensate the Municipality for these costs. The current Multi-Year Funding Agreement addresses costs such as community wellbeing investments, the hiring of consultants to peer review studies, and the cost to develop the Municipality's Housing Growth Strategy. If the Municipality is selected, the Hosting Agreement commits the NWMO to also fund municipal costs for taking part in the regulatory process.

Services and Infrastructure

The Hosting Agreement includes funding for additional services and infrastructure upgrades required for the Project. This will address Principles 28 to 30 and it includes emergency services, infrastructure, and road networks. The Agreement also commits NWMO to establish a road-use agreement with the Municipality, as noted in Principle 31.

As per Principle 32, the NWMO funding will also need to address a strategy for the demographic impacts of the Project. The Hosting Agreement commits the NWMO to complying with municipal official plan and zoning requirements.

Governance and engagement/regional benefits

Principles 34–35 refer to governance – the voice and rights of the Municipality in decision making related to the Project. These Principles are described in detail in the Hosting Agreement.

Principle 36 is a responsibility of the NWMO to demonstrate the benefits to the region beyond South Bruce.

These continue to serve an important purpose by advancing community interests.
